Welcome to Farnsfield Cricket Club, I have the pleasure of heading up all cricket here and what an honour it is to do so. Cricket continues to grow at the club with more avenues and teams set to play for the club in 2025. As Head of Cricket, it is my pleasure to welcome you all this season to Station Lane, and thank you all for your support.

Our offering of cricket across Open Age, Juniors and Women's & Girls' sections continues to go from strength to strength. This year we will be fielding 4 Open Age sides, a women's team in softball Cricket and, for the first time, a team in Super 8s hard ball. As well as this, a record number of junior teams will be taking to the field this year

with 5 hardball junior age groups representing the club as well as our softball teams too.

Women's and Girls Cricket continues to grow for us as a club, and 2025 is going to be a landmark year, fielding our first ever Women's hardball team in the East Midlands Super 8 competition. We wish our Women's teams the best of luck for this upcoming season.

Our Junior section, an envy of other local clubs in the area for years, continues to thrive, with training on Friday nights at Station Lane, a staple for the community to enjoy the summer sunshine. We have juniors from age 5 now partaking in our softball programmes all the

way up to our U19s team. Last year we saw record numbers of over 170 active junior members enjoying our cricket programme, a testament to the hard work and dedication put in by so many volunteers across our club.

We continue to provide a fantastic feed of young players into the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire County Cricket set ups, with 4 of our junior players representing the counties from U14s through to U18s cricket, highlighting the success of our junior cricket section.

We have four senior teams across our open age cricket, three on a Saturday playing in the Bassetlaw Cricket League, and one Sunday development side. The 1st XI will be vying for promotion once again into the Nottinghamshire Premier League, with a young side, growing from strength to strength. Our 2nd XI, play in Division 1, after winning Division 2 last year and our 3rd XI, play in Division 4, also securing promotion last summer. Like 2024 we have also entered the National Village Cup this year, along with the league T20 and 40 over competitions. Last year we reached the final of the Popkess County Cup, narrowly losing to Wollaton in the final at Southwell in September.

In addition to the above last year we welcomed Michael Archer, a leg spinning all-rounder from Carlton Cricket Club in Melbourne. Michael had an astonishing year, scoring over 500 runs in league cricket and taking over 60 wickets, a league record in all cricket leagues across not only Nottinghamshire but the East Midlands as well.

We have to say a huge thank you to our sponsors for the year for their continued support. In particular, the support given by Hexgreave Estate. Gascoines, and McBride Sport has enabled us to deliver our exceptional cricket programme to boys and girls in the local community and playing an active role in their development as young people. HISTORY OF THE CLUB

We know from references in Nottinghamshire newspapers that cricket was being played in Farnsfield as early as 1817.

The ground we now occupy at Station Lane was first used in 1862 when the Newark Advertiser of June 25th reported a well contested match between Farnsfield Cricket Club and Nottingham United Commercial which Farnsfield won by seven wickets.

In 1920 Farnsfield joined the North Notts Cricket League and later the Nottinghamshire County League winning the Championship in 1930.

After the 2nd World War Farnsfield were founder members of the Mansfield and District League, winning the Championship trophy for the first three seasons.

For many years the club had two teams in the Bassetlaw and District League, first winning the then Division 1 championship in 1989 the same year that the 2nd XI won the 2nd team championship!

In 2006 we entered a 3rd team in the Bassetlaw and District League and in 2013 we took over the former Edingley CC ground in Farnsfield as a permanent home for them.

WHO WE ARE NOW

Farnsfield Cricket Club offers cricket opportunities all year round from softball tournaments to competitive league cricket, indoor nets and junior winter academy.

Having launched the careers of some home-grown talent including Paul Franks (Nottinghamshire CCC and England), Brett Hutton (Nottinghamshire CCC, Northamptonshire CCC and England U19s) and Sam Wood (Nottinghamshire CCC and England U19s) we continue to offer cricket to future generations in the interest of sustaining the sport in our village and for others to have the chance to follow in their footsteps.

Throughout the summer cricket season we run junior softball and hardball training sessions on a Friday night. This is always well attended by children from Farnsfield and the surrounding area. Run by volunteer ECB level 1 (Foundation) and Level 2 (Core) coaches who are representative of our senior teams, we actively encourage children of all ages and abilities to join in, have fun, learn cricketing skills and take pleasure in playing cricket. In 2023, an all-girl group was created and coached by 2 ECB female coaches, this proved extremely popular and in 2025 an FCC team will be entered in the U11 all girl Kwik Cricket League.

We offer competitive cricket for all of our junior members including Kwik Cricket tournaments for our 5-11 year olds and league hardball cricket for Under 11's. Under 13's. Under 15's and Under 19's with many of our aspiring cricketers progressing to our successful senior teams. Throughout the Winter our junior academy offers our young hardball players the opportunity to practise and develop their skills in small groups in preparation for the following season and for the step up to senior cricket. To complement the investment in our junior players, we offer all year-round training and development opportunities for our senior players as well, training together throughout the winter utilising the nets at Cuckney, Wellow School, Samworth Church Academy and junior training at Ravenshead Leisure Centre and at Station Lane throughout the summer cricket season.

We run three open age teams all playing competitive league cricket on a Saturday and a Sunday Development team through which junior Cricketers get the opportunity to play the long format games of Cricket. In 2024, a Farnsfield T20 team played in a National Village Cup competition and reached the 2nd round and the Sunday 1st team were runners

up in the Popkess Trophy losing to Wollaton 2s.

In 2022. Farnsfield created their first Women's and Girls' section. Currently, the team competes during the Winter in the Nottinghamshire Indoor Softball League and in the Summer plays in the East Midlands Women's Softball Cricket League and in 2025 will be entering a team in the EMWCL Super 8s Hardball League.

All at the Cricket Club pride themselves on their team spirit and fair play having signed up to our "Players Charter." The teams have shared many successes between them over the years, as division winners and in receiving regional and league team and individual awards. Over the years many of our players, both male and female have represented the County at Junior level. Farnsfield Cricket Club has embedded itself in and become a thriving part of the local community, hosting a number of fundraising and community events throughout the year.



Captains' Reviews of 2024 **Ben Kilford** 1st XI Captain



2024 was another challenging season for the 1st XI. as we continued our pursuit of promotion back into the Nottinghamshire Premier League. Despite our best efforts, we finished in 2nd place for the third consecutive year, narrowly missing out to a dominant Cuckney side. However, the team's resilience was on full display as we also reached the final of the Popkess County Cup, where we faced Wollaton, falling just short of securing silverware.

A stand out performer this season was our overseas player, Michael Archer from Melbourne, Australia. Michael's impact both on and off the field was invaluable, and he delivered exceptional performances

throughout the summer. With 64 wickets and over 500 runs. Michael's contribution was crucial to our campaign. His remarkable tally of wickets earned him the Bassetlaw Bowling Award. We wish him all the best as he returns to Carlton Cricket Club in Australia.

Throughout the season, there were some memorable wins, including a 51 -run victory over Bawtry and a thrilling 7-run win over Cuckney at their home ground—both teams were also in the promotion race. In addition to Michael's brilliance. Fred Skelton (VC) and Peter Frettingham both amassed over 500 runs, playing vital innings at key moments. On the bowling front, Alex Ainger claimed the team's Bowling Award with 36 wickets, consistently stepping up when we needed him most. His partnerships with Michael were instrumental, and Alex's knack for taking wickets at critical points was a highlight of our campaign.

As a team, we continue to grow in experience and determination, and our ambition for promotion remains strong. We'll be back in 2025, fighting harder than ever to make it into the Nottinghamshire Premier League.

As a veteran of the club with almost 25 years at Farnsfield Cricket Club, I have seen the club grow so much over the years and it has been a pleasure to have been a part of it.

Farnsfield Cricket Club has been a big part of my life, so when the captaincy of the 2nd XI became available, I knew it was time to step up. This was something I felt strongly about and hoped my experience and passion would help take the 2nd XI back to Division 1.

What a journey it was last season! It is hard to believe how far we have come and how much the team achieved. It's great to see a lot of the

young players contributing, with the likes of Cam Jackson, Will Wheatley, Will Marshall and Jack Rogers all having an outstanding season and it was an absolute pleasure to watch.

With the last game of the season ahead of us, we needed a win and hoped that our rivals all season. Wiseton, failed to win their last game. We took care of our own business beating Welbeck comfortably, but it was a nail-biting wait for news from Thoresby.

And then the moment came Thoresby had scored 212 runs, but Wiseton had been bowled out for just 97. That was the moment when we knew, we had done it. We had won the league. I can't tell you how that felt, after all the hard work, all the setbacks, all the doubts. To know that we had fought back from such a deficit and seized the opportunity, was simply unbelievable.

This victory is a testament to every single person that played for the 2nd team. It's about the effort, the sacrifices, the late nights at training, and the belief we had in each other. We've had some incredible individual performances, there are far too many to mention, but what made us Champions was the strength of the team as a whole. From the top of the order to the bottom, with the first ball and the last ball bowled. everyone contributed.

All worked incredibly hard this season. But. let's also remember that we've set a standard for next year. My plan is definitely back-toback promotion and with the talent that is coming through and the strength of the existing team this is definitely achievable.

At times the side was also bolstered by players from our other senior sides which was great to see, and having their experience and ability in the team was invaluable from my perspective as skipper.

As the season progressed into the second half, we found our rhythm and really began to perform, including scoring the huge total of 309-8 against Mansfield Hosiery

Mills, which we believe is the biggest score ever recorded at Edingley.

Towards the end of the season, we were in what seemed to be a two-horse race for promotion with Langwith 1 sts, regularly exchanging places with them at the top of the league. In a nail-biting grey, cold and wet away fixture in August we managed to inch towards a low total, beat them to go top, and put us in the strongest position for promotion.

In many ways the way we won that game summed up the 3rd team

and the 2024 season. In the past year we've seen players come to the fore when it really matters, with game awareness, maturity and skill which shows how far both individual players have developed and how the group has evolved into the team it is now.

Despite just missing out on being crowned champions following the last result of the season, it's been a fantastic year for us and I'm looking forward to seeing what 2025 has in store for the 3rds.
